



2021 MT. HARLAN PINOT NOIR MILLS VINEYARD

POINTS

"A nervy, chalky, mineral-driven wine that's unusual in California, gaining a distinctive profile from great acidity and a stony character. Made from tiny yields from vines growing on their own roots instead of being grafted onto rootstock, another reason that it's a rarity. A smoky, flinty quality complements vivid red cherries, red tea and chalky, peppery flavors. Drinkable now, but best from 2029."

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"Deep and brooding aromas of lavender, lilac and purple fruit are cut by a kick of cedar on the nose of this bottling, which came from vines yielded less than a half-ton per acre. The palate is generous with red plum and cherry flavors that are enhanced by elegant floral tones and a lightly bitter finish. Prevalent tannins ensure graceful aging. Drink now-2041."
