"The 2023 Pinot Noir Jensen Vineyard was picked over a super-compressed period of two days, whereas it usually comes in over the course of three to six weeks. It's a deeply pitched, resonant wine that just sings in the glass despite its dark, brooding personality. That said, the 2023 Jensen is still very young, but it boasts supremely refined tannins. Delicate layers of raspberry, new leather, black tea, and white pepper meld together effortlessly in total harmony. I'm enamored with the Jensen's sense of plushness, not a characteristic I often find in these wines. Gorgeous."

"The biggest, boldest of the single sites, the 2023 Pinot Noir Jensen Vineyard is from some of the original vines first planted in 1975 at 2,200-foot elevation still on St. George rootstock. From one of the wettest years on record, it tastes of herb, forest chaparral, and tart acidity, mouth-filling on the midpalate in full-bodied berry intensity, the rich, layered fruit dusted in baking spice and cardamom. From Calera selection clones and 100% whole-cluster fermented on native yeasts, it's a fine representation of place and exceptional winemaking."

"Gently mulled red currant, boysenberry and black cherry fruit percolates with underlying energy, while dried anise, blood orange zest and iris details weave in and out. There's a chiseled, chalky spine driving underneath, plus late echoes of tea and bergamot. For the cellar. Best from 2027 through 2038. 425 cases made."
