"Densely packed with dark cherry, blackberry and red currant paste flavors, this is also well-structured, with its chiseled grip helping to drive everything through the lengthy finish, where flashes of dried anise, iris and singed apple wood emerge. There's a chalky spine buried, which helps create a mouthwatering sensation. This will need some time."

"Another exceptional wine from the vintage, the 2023 Pinot Noir de Villiers Vineyard is from the estate's 1997-planted, own-rooted vines all at 2,200-foot elevation. Tightly wound in tart red fruit, dried herb, and undeniable minerality, the tannins are dusty and chalky in texture, while balanced acidity keeps things fresh. Aged for 18 months in French oak, 30% new, it's a full-bodied, generously layered wine that speaks loudly of its place, lush on the finish, from a vintage that saw the highest amount of rainfall on Mount Harlan on record."
